CHAPTER SUMMARY

Peter and John are arrested after preaching about Jesus, then boldly testify before the Jewish council. When threatened, they obey God and keep speaking. The believers pray together, receive fresh boldness, and live with generous care for one another.



CORE TRUTH

God's people are called to speak about Jesus with courage, trust His rule over opposition, and show genuine unity through love, prayer, and generous care.



DID YOU KNOW?

The Sadducees were especially upset because Peter and John preached the resurrection of Jesus. They held religious power in Jerusalem, but they did not believe in resurrection, so the apostles' message directly challenged them.
