Scripture Spotlight

Acts 5:29
"We ought to obey God rather than men."



CHAPTER SUMMARY

Acts 5 warns against pretending before God through Ananias and Sapphira, then shows the apostles ministering with power. When religious leaders arrest them, an angel frees them and sends them back to teach. After trial and beating, they rejoice and keep preaching Jesus.



CORE TRUTH

God cares about truth in His people and courage in His witnesses. Acts 5 teaches that hidden sin is serious, but faithful obedience to Christ must continue even when people oppose it.



DID YOU KNOW?

Gamaliel was a respected Jewish teacher in the council. His advice kept the apostles from being killed that day, but Acts 5 still shows that cautious delay is not the same as true faith in Jesus.
