CHAPTER SUMMARY

As the Jerusalem church grew, a complaint arose because Hellenist widows were being overlooked in daily care. The apostles led the believers to appoint seven qualified servants so prayer and Scripture teaching could continue. The gospel kept advancing, but Stephen's powerful witness brought dishonest accusations and a council trial.



CORE TRUTH

God's work needs both faithful service and faithful preaching. The church protected unity by caring for neglected people, choosing Spirit-filled servants, and keeping prayer and God's Word at the center of ministry.



DID YOU KNOW?

The complaint in Acts 6 involved Hebrews and Hellenists. Hellenists were Greek-speaking Jews from outside Judea, so language and cultural differences may have made the neglect of their widows especially painful and dangerous for church unity.
