CHAPTER SUMMARY

On the Day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came with power. The disciples were filled and spoke in other tongues. Peter stood and proclaimed Jesus as Lord and Messiah. About three thousand people believed, were baptized, and the church was born.

Peter called the people to repent, be baptized, and receive God's promised gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit empowers every believer to witness. Jesus is Lord and Messiah.
