Peter and John boldly proclaim Jesus as the only one by whom we can be saved. The religious leaders oppose them, but the early church responds with prayer, unity, and uncompromising faith.

"Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

AT A GLANCE

- Peter and John heal a lame man in Jesus' name.
- They boldly preach that Jesus is the only Savior.

- The believers pray together, asking God for boldness.
- The Holy Spirit fills them, and they speak God's Word with power.

CORE TRUTH

Jesus is the one and only Savior. True authority comes from God, and bold witnesses trust Him no matter the opposition.



DID YOU KNOW?

"The place" where Peter and John were arrested was likely the Temple area or portico of Solomon, a public space in Jerusalem (v. 3). The number of men was "about five thousand" (v. 4)—evidence of the church's rapid growth.

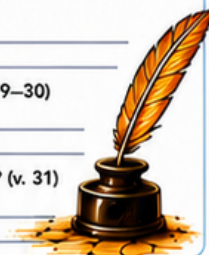
