TRUTH, COURAGE, AND THE NAME OF JESUS

Acts 5 shows God guarding the purity of His church, confirming the apostles' witness through signs and wonders, and giving boldness under pressure. Though threatened, imprisoned, and beaten, the apostles obey God, rejoice in suffering, and keep teaching Jesus as the Christ.

CORE TRUTH

God calls His people to honest hearts, holy fear, and bold obedience. When leaders command silence, faithful witnesses still speak the truth about Jesus.

Solomon's Porch was a public area in the temple complex where people gathered. In Acts 5, the apostles teach there openly, even after opposition grows. The message of Jesus is not hidden—it is proclaimed in the heart of Jerusalem.
