Scripture Spotlight

Acts 9:20
Immediately he preached the Christ in the synagogues, that He is the Son of God.



CHAPTER SUMMARY

Acts 9 shows Saul traveling to arrest believers, meeting the risen Jesus, receiving help from Ananias, and beginning to preach Christ. Barnabas helps the church receive him. The chapter closes with Peter healing Aeneas and raising Tabitha, leading many in Lydda, Sharon, and Joppa to the Lord.



CORE TRUTH

Jesus can stop a fierce enemy, turn him into a faithful witness, and strengthen His church through ordinary obedient servants who pray, welcome, heal, serve, and point others to Him.



DID YOU KNOW?

Damascus was far from Jerusalem, which shows Saul's campaign was not a quick errand. Later, Peter stayed in Joppa with Simon, a tanner, a detail that quietly prepares readers for the next chapter's wider gospel doorway.
